

His Excellency Mr. Kim Jong-un,

I hope that all is well. As I am extremely interested in the Korean Peninsula situation improving and having peace, as well as how I am extremely interested in the government of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea and the government of Japan entering and engaging in peace talks with one another, I wanted to let you know that Prime Minister Shinzō Abe of Japan is planning on visiting the People's Republic of China in December of this year. While that information is of course in no way a secret and has been made available to the public, it should be known that Prime Minister Shinzō Abe is going to be traveling to the People's Republic of China for talks with Chinese Premier Li Keqiang and South Korean President Moon Jae-in.
